Prayer To St. Michael

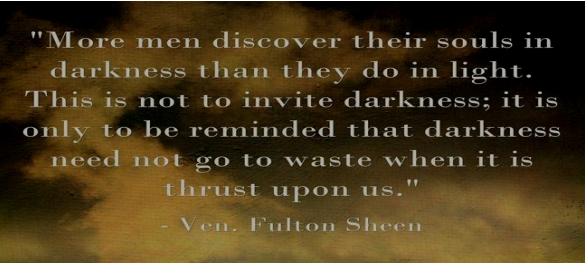

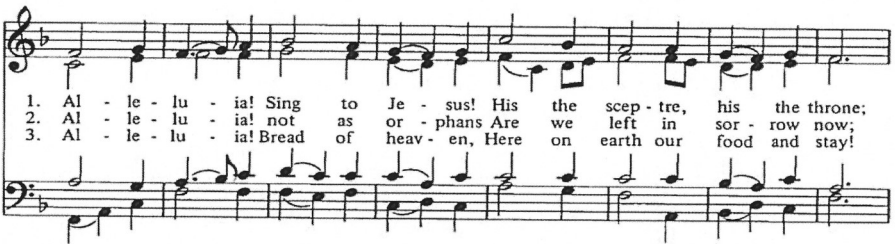


Prayer For Vocations

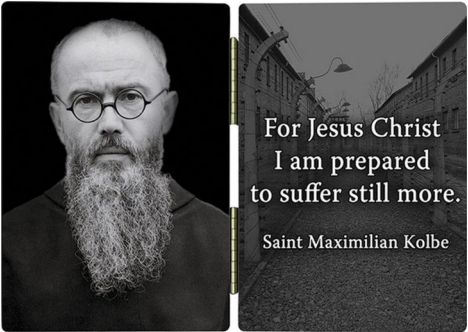
John 6:24-35

Profession of Faith - Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
